It came into existence with the spontaneous help and support of the rank and file of five development block areas - Krishnagar-II block, Nakashipara block, Kaliganj block, Chapra block, and Palashipara block. Outline of Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)

1. Core Course (CC): A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.

2. Elective Course: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the student's proficiency/skill is termed as an Elective Course.

2.1 Discipline Specific Elective Course (DSEC): Elective courses that are offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).

2.2 Generic Elective Course (GEC): An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic Elective.

3. Ability Enhancement Courses/ Skill Enhancement Courses:

3.1 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC): Ability enhancement courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. They (i) Environmental Science, (ii) English Communication) are mandatory for all disciplines.

3.2 Skill Enhancement Course (SEC): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based instruction.

Review & Scrutiny: There shall be re-evaluation (review) of the answer scripts of theoretical papers of semester-end-examinations but not of Internal Assessment marks. However, for re-evaluation, the candidate has to apply through the concerned Principals/TIC of Colleges in a prescribed format, to the Controller of Examinations. Re-evaluation shall be permitted in not more than two theoretical papers for any semester-end-examination in the 3 year Bachelor's degree programme on submission of prescribed fees within 07 working days from the publication of result of concerned semester. No application for re-evaluation of practical papers shall be entertained. *The examiner of a paper shall not be the reviewer of the same paper.*

Scrutiny of the theoretical answer scripts shall be done by the teachers of the concerned discipline before sending the marks to the Controller of Examinations. A teacher who is the examiner of a paper shall not be the scrutinizer of the same paper.

The written answer scripts of each semester-end examination will be preserved by the Head Examiner up to the completion of review process of that answer scripts. After that the answer scripts shall be collected by the Controller of Examinations and shall be preserved in the University for 06 (Six) months only from the date of publication of that result of the said semester-end examination. The answer scripts of the class test or other records of internal assessment shall, however, be preserved in the College for six (06) months from the date of commencement of the next Semester. After that period, the scripts will be disposed off as per rules of the University.

Courses Offered

❖ Under-graduate Courses Offered (Three years):

Since the academic session of 2018 the three years undergraduate course is being conducted under the new Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) as adopted by University of Kalyani.

1. Subject Thought:

The college offers Honours courses in Accountancy, Bengali, History, Geography, English and Political Science. 2. Session:

The Academic Session commences from July every year with the odd semesters, namely, 1st, 3rd and 5th semester. According to the University stipulations, classes for the next semester will start immediately after seven days of the completion of the previous semester's examination.

❖ Post- graduate Courses Offered (Two years):

Kalyani University Directorate of Open and Distance Learning (DODL):

Admission Procedure

❖ Admission Qualifications:

1. Eligibility & Recognized Boards:

A candidate may be admitted to the first semester of three-year(Six Semester) B.A./ B.Sc./ B.Com.(Honours & Programme/General) Courses of Studies on passing Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination in General conducted by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or an equivalent examination conducted by other State Board/Council, or The W.B. Council of Rabindra Open Schooling, or The National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) recognized by the Distant Education Bureau(DEB)**subject to fulfillment of the conditions mentioned below:**

Candidates from 'other' Boards:

In case of other Boards/Councils, a candidate shall have to pass in five recognized subjects, of which one shall be English, of full marks not being less than 100 each. A candidate passing in four subjects shall not be eligible for admission.

2. Permissible chances of admission:

Candidates shall be allowed for admission within 03 (three) consecutive academic sessions including the year of passing the previous qualifying examination. (For example: candidates passing H.S. Examination in the year 2018 will get last chance of admission in the academic session 2020-2021.)

3. Eligibility for pursuing Honours Course of studies:

A candidate taking up Honours Course in a subject must have obtained:

(I) A minimum of **45%** marks in aggregate and **55%** marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination. **OR**

(II) **50%** marks in aggregate and **45%** marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination. **OR**

(III) **55%** marks in aggregate when the candidate has not studied the subject or any related subject in his /her previous qualifying examination provided all other clauses are complied.

3.a) Relaxation: However, candidates belonging to the Schedule Caste or Schedule Tribe Community taking up Honours Course of Study shall enjoy 5% relaxation in marks in (I), (II) & (III) above, as the case may be-

Explanation: (i) Aggregate means the sum of marks of best scored five (05) subjects excluding compulsory Environmental Education/Environmental Science/Environmental Studies.

(ii) While calculating such aggregate, full marks of each such subject will be scaled down to 100 wherever needed.

4. Merit List:

4(a). *Admission process will be strictly online and on the basis of merit. Merit list will be prepared uniformly on the basis of the following criteria:*

(i) In case of Honours courses: Aggregate (as per previous explanation) plus the marks obtained in the subject in which he/she intends to take up honours or related subject. However, students who avail themselves of the Rule 3(III) will not get the benefit of 'related subject'.

(ii) In case of Programme /General courses: Merit list will be prepared on the basis of aggregate.

4(b). For admission to Honours courses complete list of all applicants is according to merit to be published at the first instance and admission be done preferably through counseling in accordance with the intake capacity.

4(c). For admission to Programme/General courses complete list of all applicants according to merit to be published at the first instance and admission be done preferably through counseling in accordance with the intake capacity.

4(d). While admitting candidates from the merit list if it is found at some point of time that the approved intake is to be increased as a special case likely to be breached due to sharing of the same merit position by more than one candidate then in that case all the candidates at that particular merit position may be admitted subject to prior approval of the Vice-Chancellor and the excess admission will be granted only for that year.

The College Library

The college has library with more than 12,500 books and the college has subscribed more than 32 journals. Students can borrow books from there. Digital cataloguing is available. There is also reading room facility. The honours students can also avail their departmental libraries. The college has subscribed **e-sodhSindhu** through N-list. Thus our students and teachers can be benefited from internet facilities.



The college takes a serious view of any form of indiscipline with respect to the library. Indiscipline includes creating noise and any form of disturbance inside the library and its immediate vicinity ; disfiguring or damaging books furniture or other library property; undue delay in return of books issued, etc.

The library committee will deal with any act of indiscipline with respect to the library and is empowered to debar any student indulge in such acts from further use of the library.

Besides the college library, students are also offered the facility of departmental libraries, and may contact their respective departments about the same.

The college invites and encourages students to take an active part in maintaining the discipline and decorum of the library and contribute to its smooth functioning.



Rules and Regulations for Students

- Students must be punctual and regular in class attendance.
- Appearing in the college examination is mandatory.
- 75% of attendance in both theoretical and practical classes is essential to appeared in the universe city examination.
- Identity card, Laboratory card and Library card must be brought regularly.
- Loitering in the corridors is strictly prohibited.
- Use of mobile phones in the classroom/ laboratory /corridor is not allowed.
- Attendance of parents in Guardian Teacher meeting is obligatory.
- Student must carry their identity card whenever they are present in college premises.
- Honourable Supreme Court has ruled that ragging is a criminal offence. The college has adopted a "zero-tolerance" policy regarding in any form. Any student found involved in ragging another student in the college premises will face severe punishment which will include immediate expulsion.
- Students' fee concession (tuition fee) will be allowed only for student in BPL category/ really economically distressed with successful academic attainment and minimum attendance of 60%.

Multi-Service Facilities for Students

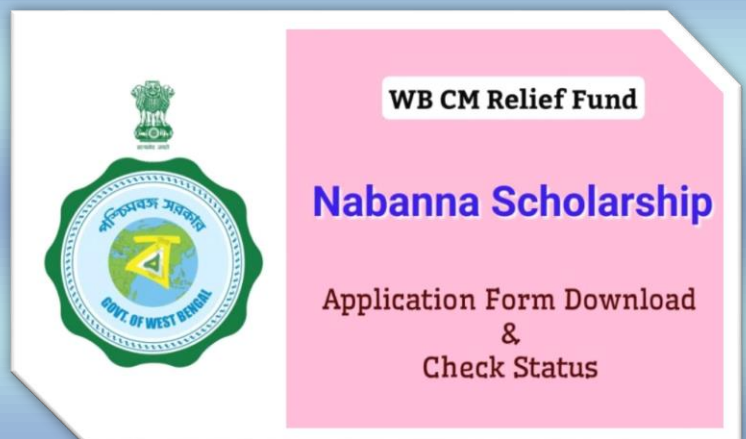
A. Scholarship

The West Bengal and the central government implement several top scholarship schemes in Bengal for needy and meritorious students. These scholarships usually include reimbursement of tuition fees, maintenance fees and other essentials allowances. The main motive behind these scholarships is to provide financial assistance to the students of Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Class, Minority, Disabled Welfare Communities etc. The Government of West Bengal and other private organization together offer several scholarships for meritorious and underprivileged students of the State. The key objective of each West Bengal scholarship is to encourage and motivate deserving students to pursue further studies in any financial constraint.

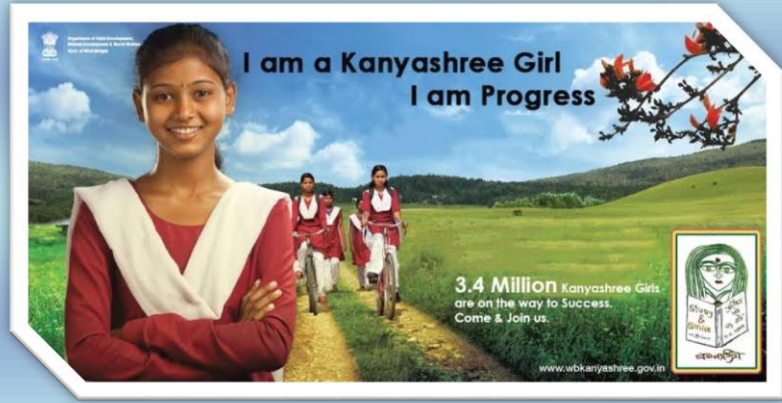
1. Swami Vivekananda Merit cum Means Scholarship: Swami Vivekananda Merit Scholarship has been managed/operated by the W. B. Govt. for the students who are not able to afford their fees. The scholarships are provided to the students who are studying the Under Graduation and Post-Graduation. This scholarship will help the students in getting a good education and overcoming related financial burdens. Those students have scored **60%** marks in Higher Secondary examination are eligible for this scholarship. The annual family income of the applicant should not exceed Rs. **250000** /-.



2. Nabanna Scholarship: The Chief Minister of West Bengal provides scholarships every year to the students. This scholarship is also known as 'Nabanna Scholarship'. Those students who have scored **60%** marks in Higher Secondary examination are eligible for this scholarship but students whose score more than **75%** are not eligible for this Scholarship. The annual family income of the applicant should not exceed Rs. **60000**/-.



3. Kanyashree Prakalpa: Kanyashree Prakalpa seeks to improve the status and wellbeing of girls, particularly those from socio-economic disadvantaged families through conditional cash transfers. Its aims are to ensure that girls stay in School and Colleges and delay their marriage till at least age 18. K-2, is a one-time grant of Rs. 25000 /- to be paid after a girl turns 18, provided that she was engaged in an academic or occupational pursuit and was unmarried.



4. OASIS Scholarship: Backward Classes Welfare Department of West Bengal Govt. providing OASIS Scholarship for SC, ST and OBC students to help them financially for their higher studies. Candidate will be selected for this Scholarship on the basis of their financial condition and merit.



5. Aikyashree Scholarship: The students from a poor family and also belongs to the Minority section, they can have benefit of this Aikyashree Scholarship. The **Minorities Development and Finance Corporation** of West Bengal has the nodal organization.



B. Fees Concession

There is a system of fee concession for needy but academically sound students. The needy and intelligent student of general category who do not avail any other scholarship facilities may apply to get the benefit of fee concession.

C. Career Counseling Cell

The career Guidance and Placement cell has been set up in the college for the benefit of the students. Primary objective of the cell is to provide the much needed life skills to students and help them to find job placements. The Cell's activities are initiated by the teaching faculty of different departments.

To keep pace with the present stiff competition, the placement cell has undertaken several measures like organizing seminars, mock interviews, soft skills, communicative skills, personality development, corporate culture/etiquette and leadership skills to the students.

The college has integrated the Career Guidance with the Placement cell. The Cell offers guidance to students regarding different path ways in higher education and other career opportunities apart from placement support. Example, a person with creative personality will succeed as a writer and a person who is an introvert is less likely to succeed in face to face sales promotion. If you choose a field that excites you, you will not only enjoy your work but will also excel in your chosen field. Understanding your personality is key in choosing the right career path. Every student of every department is welcome and all students may feel free to come to the Counseling Cell.

D. Anti-Ragging Cell
